31st May is the day which reminds us how important our life is. We are celebrating the World No Tobacco Day. This day is celebrated to aware people about the effects of chewing tobacco and Nicotine that causes cancer and many severe diseases. Tobacco is the biggest enemy of public health today. The effects of tobacco use, as we all know, are destructive and widespread. Irrespective of cultures and countries, backgrounds and ethnicities, tobacco is chewed in different forms and ways. Chewing tobacco reduces the lungs to a sponge that soaks in at least 30 known carcinogens, or cancer causing chemicals. Our country has the largest film producing industry in the world with 900 films per year and 250 million viewers including those watching television and cable shows. Film stars are very popular in India. They are involved in many public issues and they get countless media coverage. Despite the warnings given by doctors about the ill-effects of smoking, people continue to smoke. Smokers are addicted

to it, and even if they want to, they cannot refrain from picking up a cigar or cigarette and puffing away. Some youngsters smoke for the sake of society and some feel that would make them appear liberated and broadminded.

Tobacco companies are doing very well all over the world. Every packet of cigars or cigarettes has a warning inscribed in it: cigarette smoking is injurious to health. Yet the smoker never reads this warning and even if he reads it he never gives heed to it. The list of tobacco related diseases is long and includes heart and blood vessel diseases, bronchitis, asthma, impotence, birth defects and growth retardation in babies, etc. Tobacco smoking is a major risk factor in developing cardiovascular disease, stroke, cancer and chronic obstructive lung diseases. It also increases a person's risk of developing tuberculosis. Tobacco kills almost six million people each year and more than 600,000 are non-smokers breathing second-hand smoke. Tobacco smoke contains approximately 4,000 chemicals in cigarettes, 100s of which are toxic like formaldehyde, ammonia and cadmium. Tobacco causes cancer and most of us are aware that smoking causes lung cancer and chewing tobacco causes oral cancer. Cigarette smoking is a gift of modern times and has become a fashionable way of life. Many psychologists have done detailed statistical studies, to investigate why people smoke? Their findings

are indeed shocking. The reasons given by smokers indicate that it is habit forming, increases concentration, and helps in killing time and to be in fashion. We need to spread the message about the dangers of tobacco use, need to continue throughout the year. Smoking in public places is also an infringement on the fundamental right of our fellow citizens, for it violates their right to live. Our protagonist may argue that banning smoking would violate the fundamental right of the individual. This is untrue, as no one has the right to endanger his own life, what to talk of others around him. If a person wants to smoke, that is his own personal choice. However, the health effects that come with it affect nonsmokers, from the secondhand smoke to litter, and cause just as much damage to the people around them, something that cannot be ignored. An tobacco advertising ban on tobacco is not something that is other tobacco control measures including increasing taxes, setting up smoking cessation clinics, banning public smoking or putting up health warnings. How Yahya Sinwar's death presents Israel with a chance to end Gaza war

On October 16, Israel continued its run of successful elimination of top leadership of the opposing forces when it eliminated the elusive Hamas leader, Yahya Sinwar, in a gun battle in the Gaza strip. Unlike some of the other successful assassinations of top political and military leaders of Hamas and Hezbollah in the past few months, this wasn't a planned operation but a gunfight, which resulted in the deaths of three Hamas operatives, including Sinwar.

Confirming the news to the Israeli Foreign Minister Israel Katz called Sinwar 'a mass murderer who was responsible for the massacre and atrocities of October 7', adding that it is a military and moral achievement for the Israeli army. Israeli PM Netanyahu, in a televised address, stated that Israeli forces have delivered 'a blow to evil,' adding that 'while this is not the end of the war in Gaza, it's the beginning of the end.' US President Biden congratulated Israel on a very important tactical victory on the battlefield, adding that Sinwar's death marks a moment of relief for Israelis while providing the opportunity for a 'day after' in Gaza without the group in power. Firstly, he is supposed to be the mastermind of the audacious terror attack launched by Hamas on October 7 last year, which caught Israel totally by surprise and resulted in the killing of over 1,400 Israeli citizens. Secondly, he was the head of Hamas, appointed soon after the assassination of its political chief, Ismail

Haniyeh, on July 31, in Tehran. Thirdly, he planned and directed the entire military operation of Hamas in Gaza. Even the intricate underground tunnel network running more than 150 km in Gaza is supposed to be his brainchild. He also carried immense duty in highest decision-making process, to say the least, some other killings in Hamas leadership too have been significant. On January 2, Hamas's deputy leader abroad, Saleh al-Arouri, the leader of Hamas's military wing in the West Bank, was killed in an Israeli strike in the Beirut suburb of Dahiyeh. Another top military commander of Hamas, Mohammed Deif, was killed in an Israeli air raid in southern Gaza on July 13 (although Hamas is yet to confirm it). However, for Israel, the prize was always Sinwar, who was being hunted for the last 12 months. The news of the killing of Sinwar has therefore not come as a shock, and the fact that he went down fighting with his troops in Gaza clearly reflects two things. One that he would have weighed the risks of being out in the open and therefore would have left instructions for his successor in case of his death. Secondly, as a corollary to the first, his elimination is unlikely to 'eliminate Hamas from the face of the earth', something that Israel had set

as a war objective. For Israel, this lucky break can yield either of the two outcomes. Either it could claim that, with the killing of Yahya Sinwar, the main architect of the Gaza war has been removed, and therefore, it could call it a decisive victory, settle for a ceasefire, and seek an honourable 'exit' with momentum on its side. On the other hand, it could take this tactical victory as an opportunity to further intensify its operations against Hamas, hoping to deliver the final death blow to the group.



If it takes the first option, Israel could squeeze itself back on the negotiating table after weeks of stalled process of ceasefire talks. It may also hope to get more of its terms included in the ceasefire deal now that Sinwar is no longer there. On the other hand, it could take inspiration from the lives and deaths of its leaders and carry on the fight. It has a successful example of Hezbollah to emulate, which, even after the elimination of the top three layers of its leadership, including its charismatic leader Hassan Nasrallah, is giving an equal fight to Israeli forces in southern Lebanon, preventing Israeli forces from making any major breakthroughs and inflicting heavy losses to personnel and weapon platforms. The drone video of Sinwar's last moments, released by the Israeli army in exuberance, should count as a tactical error as the Hamas cadres are witnessing their leader going down fighting instead of being hunted down in the tunnels, something that can only inspire new cadres and leaders to fight on. A statement from Iran's permanent mission to the UN stating, 'When Muslims look up to the martyr Sinwar standing on the battlefield, in combat attire and out in the open, not in a hideout, facing

Grey silence

Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Haryana, Kerala, Telangana—the list of states where the media comes up against State repression is growing longer. This is increasingly where the challenges to free speech are, with bureaucrats honing their media management skills and the local police making arrests with alacrity. States across the country are restraining and detaining reporters seeking to do their job. The courts step in sometimes to give bail or dismiss the cases.

Just last week, in Telangana, a journalist with a digital portal called Telugu Scribe was granted bail by the Nampally court after he was arrested for posting a video seven months earlier featuring a former prime minister, K. Chandrashekar Rao. The farmer praised KCR and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi's policies, particularly the Rythu Bandhu scheme, and said that he had financial difficulties under the current administration. The journalist, Gowtham Pothagoni, faces four first information reports, allegedly for promoting public disharmony. The provocation varies from state to state. Earlier this month, the Kerala High Court declined to pass orders imposing restrictions on media reporting on the rehabilitation and reconstruction being undertaken by the state government after the landslides in Wayanad. The court said that it expected the media to exercise due care and caution while reporting news on the matter. "We cannot ignore the settled law governing the right to freedom of speech and expression of the media, which clearly states that reasonable restrictions in addition to what is already mentioned in Article

19(2) of the Constitution of India cannot be imposed on the media," it said. In the meantime, three press associations have expressed concern over the detention of several journalists in recent months in Bihar's Vaishali and Muzaffarpur districts. Their statement referred to two murders of journalists in Muzaffarpur and the recent arrest of the YouTuber, Mithun Mishra, who was held for a day after he tried to report on flood damage in the area. He was arrested while recording a clash between demonstrators, who were protesting regarding flood relief efforts, and the police on the NH-77 in Muzaffarpur. The FIR names over 20 people as accused. To add insult to injury, the Uttar Pradesh government introduced a new digital media policy in August this year, designed essentially to use social media content creators for advertising. It set out to empower social media influencers and content creators and issue them advertisements about the state government's schemes and achievements with monthly payments ranging between Rs 2 lakh and Rs 8 lakh to each entity. Its officials assiduously worked out criteria for applicants in terms of subscribers and the number of original videos posted. The government said the idea was to reach millennials. You could read that as millennial voters in light of the Bharatiya Janata Party's dismal performance in the state in the Lok Sabha elections. If this was the carrot, the stick was a clause which said legal action would be initiated against content creators by the Director of Information of the Uttar Pradesh government for content deemed anti-national or for painting the government in a bad light. The policy contained a provision for punishment ranging from three years to life imprisonment (for anti-national activities), and that an accused could also stand trial for criminal defamation

Ahmedabad, After 14 years, the mystery of Ahmedabad's murder case, like Ajay Devgn's film Skryna, has been solved. 14 years ago today, after killing the manager of a hotel in Vejalpur, his body was buried in the kitchen and covered with white cement and bricks. The crime branch has taken up the challenge of solving the unsolved murder cases and success is on hand. In this case, the crime branch has arrested the accused from Mehnsana. After killing the manager, the killer also changed his name and identity. He went to live in Rajasthan, where he also got married.

The accused and Mrikat lived in the same room. The fact of this extremely brutal murder is that 14 years ago, 34-year-old Shivnayaran alias Manish Gupta, a native of Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh, was working as a manager in Panjari Hotel of Satellite for three months. The hotel management gave him flat number 206 in B block of Vejalpur Ramnagar. In the room with him, water Jitendra Rabari and cashier Harsingh also lived.

Two district sarpanches and MPs stage protest against eco zone in Talala

On September 25, 2024, the Central Government issued a preliminary notification to declare a total area of 771,84,466.20 hectares surrounding the 'Gir Protected Area' as an 'Eco-Sensitive Zone', comprising 196 villages in 3 districts, 17 rivers. A convention of elected public representatives from Sarpanch to MP of Junagadh and Gir Somnath districts was held at Talala Marketing Yard under the auspices of Talala

Taluka Bharatiya Kisan Sangh with the demand to repeal this Act. Many leaders including MP from Sorath, district BJP president, former MLA from Visavadar were present in this convention. Rajesh Chudasma, BJP MP from Junagadh, said that in 2016, this area was in Congress majority. Even then, I stood with the farmers and made representations to the government against the eco zone. Even today for me it is first a farmer and then a



position. I will also go to Gandhinagar to present. I will also raise my objection through e-mail: MP Rajesh Chudasma

Responding to the demands of the public and farmers, MP Rajesh Chudasma said that after the Eco zone proposal sent by the government in 2016 was scrapped, the notification came out again in 2024. If a delegation of this area is formed for the eco-sensitive zone and goes to Gandhinagar to present to the government through e-mail. The MP stressed that all should raise objections against the notification within the time frame.

'Citizens and farmers protect lions more: Former MLA Harshad Ribadia said, 'As a farmer leader known as farmer leader Harshad Ribadia said, 'I am proud, lion is our pride. People and farmers are more protective of lions.

E-mail Day will be celebrated in Talala Panthak. Talala Taluka Bharatiya Kisan Sangh President Praveen Chodwadia said that emails are being sent from all over the time limit to raise objections against the announcement published to set up eco zone in Talala Panthak. Email Day will be celebrated for a significant increase in the coming days. For this the workers of Bharatiya Kisan Sangh will go from village to village. Thousands of Eco Zones will be emailed to cancel. Planning has been arranged for this.

The Supreme Court has not issued strict instructions to the public and farmers after the Eco Zone proposal was sent to the government in 2016, after which several public interest appeals were even though there is no mention of the public welfare of the people and farmers being hampered. Farmer leaders of various villages demanded that the elected representatives of the people take note of it.

The demand in the convention before the BJP representatives to stop the black law is for the democratic people and not just for the lions. The rural people and

farmers are all Hindus. 70 percent votes have been given to BJP. A strong demand was made in the convention before the elected representatives of BJP to prevent the introduction of the black law of eco-sensitive zones, which would cut the wrists of farmers.

How many wild animals were killed by farm workers in two years? Sanghani IFFCO chairman and former law minister Dilip Sanghani spoke to Khuli on the issue of eco-sensitive zones at a program at Savarkunda in Amreli district on September 15. He said that if the forest department or others want to intimidate the farmers, talk of jailing them, there is a provision in section 93, 104, 103 of the CrPC. When a person is in danger of life or property, taking the life of another person is given the right of self-defense. I want to ask the people who rescue the wild animals when the wild animals attack the laboring farmers and take their lives. In the last two years, how many wild animals were killed by farmers, laborers and people working in the fields? How many have been damaged?

Sanghani further said that as many as 39 people have died due to wild animal attacks in the last 2 years. As many as 239 people have sustained serious injuries. If there is a right to self defense for man then why not for wild animal. Our submissions on our forum continue with many such issues. Based on these ideas, the government should change the rules.

Woman brutally killed by tearing clothes, cutting hair

Songarh Panchayat Congress member violently assaulted, accused of immoral relationship, hand fractured in stick-hockey stick attack

An incident has come to light that a woman member of the Congress of Songadh Taluka Panchayat was brutally beaten near the Raniamba railway gate yesterday. The female member's hair was cut, beaten with a stick and a hockey stick. Questions have been raised about the law and order in which a woman member was fatally attacked on the charge of an immoral relationship.

A woman was beaten to death by accusing her of having an immoral relationship. On October 19 at noon, after the general meeting of the Songadh Taluka Panchayat office was over, the woman member left for her home on an Activa along with her young daughter. A mob then surrounded the woman member near Raniamba Gate on Bardipada Road in Songadh. Some of the eight to ten members of the mob, including the wife, son, who had come with a hockey stick, were accused of having an immoral relationship.

Scenes of fighting ensued as the mob washed and cut the hair of a female member in public. The cattle were brutally beaten with weapons like hoki, sticks. There were scenes of fights in public, but no one came forward to save the female member. After first aid was given to the female member in Songarh in bloody condition, she was shifted to Yvara Civil for treatment. Now it is known that the health of this woman is



improving. The woman who was 'beaten on the arm and waist with a hockey-wooden stick' told the fact that, yesterday I went to a social function in Songadh Taluka Panchayat. After that, I left for home with my daughter on another job. Then on the road about 6 to 7 people kept me standing and started beating me without saying anything. 3 days ago today I received a call from a boy. In which he threatened that 'I will kill you, I will not let you live. I then thought of filing a complaint at the police station, but did not file a

complaint and yesterday I was beaten on the arm and waist with a hockey-wooden stick. Also my clothes were torn and my hair was cut. Further, the victim said that this act was done by a woman named Shobhanaben and her son. I have had as many as 3 fractures in my hands after fighting with me. So I have filed a police complaint. In this matter, the Songarh police have registered a case against

Shobhanaben Lalsingh Gameet (res. Kosamba, Valod). Shobhanaben's son and two other women accompanying him and have taken legal action.

Tapi District Deputy Superintendent of Police Ishwar Parmar said, 'Why are you in a relationship with my husband?'

said that the accused Shobhanaben and two other women came along with her son while the complainant was going on a moped with her daughter, and said to him, 'Why are you having a relationship with my husband?' and scolded him. Shobhanaben's son took out a wooden stick from his four-wheeler and attacked the victim, injuring the woman's waist and forehead and fracturing the victim's left hand. Along with two other women, the accused Shobhanaben committed the crime by cutting the hair of the victim's head and snatching the gold pendant while holding the victim. Ahmedabad, Ahmedabad International Airport has become the 7th busiest airport in the country. A flight operates every 5.33 minutes. Flight movement has increased by 8 percent compared to last year. At present around 270 daily flights are operated from Ahmedabad airport. More than 60 lakh passengers have travelled between April and September of the year 2024. Out of which 50 lakh passengers have travelled domestically while 10 lakh passengers have travelled internationally. Domestic connectivity and passenger numbers have increased by 6 percent while international connectivity and passenger numbers have increased by 15 percent compared to last year. Delhi, Mumbai and Bangalore have the highest number of passengers on flights departing from Ahmedabad Airport, which has launched a new destination. While the number of passengers arriving and departing from Dubai, Abu Dhabi and Kuwait as the top destinations in international connectivity is the highest. It is worth mentioning that the number of flight operations and connectivity from Ahmedabad airport is increasing every year, in which new destinations have been launched by international airlines in the year 2024 to provide direct connectivity to passengers from Ahmedabad.

Flight from Ahmedabad to Kuala Lumpur started Thai Air Asia and Thai Line Air have started flight to Don Mueang International Airport in Bangkok, Thailand. Apart from this, Air Asia Barad has also started flights from Ahmedabad to Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

Ahmedabad airport has more passengers in domestic flight operations and Ahmedabad airport is also an important airport for Air India and IndiGo Airlines. Where the number of passengers and flight

Heaps of garbage lying unattended in many areas in most of the cities & towns speaks volumes about the inefficiency of the concerned authorities. With the mounds of heaps of garbage remaining uncleaned for weeks together emanating a nauseating stench all over area resulting into stinking. With heaps of garbage lying around, the dog menace has also increased. The mosquito menace has gone beyond the reasonable tolerance levels. It is also observed that garbage clearance trucks in the city are seen at some places attempting to carry out the herculean task of ridding the roads of the rotting garbage. It is not uncommon to see piles of putrefying garbage lying along the streets, in front of fancy malls and luxury car showrooms, and at the gates of many exclusive neighborhoods. But just as common is the sight of Indians walking past the smelly heaps, covering their noses with the edge of their saris or handkerchiefs and waving the flies away. Many Indians routinely throw empty cigarette packs, plastic wrappers or cans from their

car windows. Even at religious sites, waste is often dumped into rivers, lakes or the streets. Open, stinking drains in residential neighborhoods are choked with household trash.

With India's creaky municipal management system stretched thin and government response to the teeming trash patchy at best, the problem will only worsen, analysts say. More than 600 million Indians will live in cities by 2030, compared with a little more than 350 million today. Indians generate more than 55 million tons of solid waste every year, and that figure will increase to 240 million tons by 2047, according to the Energy and Resources Institute in New Delhi. But there is a new push for change from some quarters.

Neighborhood volunteers, schools and activists in big cities are organizing like rarely before to clean up India. They are staging sporadic cleanup drives at markets, beaches and railway stations. They are urging people not to litter, asking families to separate waste from recyclables and using smartphones to photograph and report uncollected garbage to the government.

Even the federal Tourism Ministry launched a campaign to keep areas around heritage monuments clean. The momentum is at least partly generated by Indians who believe that the grimy cities damage their country's image abroad and clash with its hopes of becoming a 21st-century economic power. There is an unspeakable

amount of filth around us. Sometimes we come across the garbage overflowing from the bins outside the gate and spilling out into the streets. The amount of littering and garbage generation every day is humongous.

Uncollected garbage in the city's streets swelled to such an extent that the heaps impeded pedestrians and drivers alike. To placate the protesters, the local authorities must advise the residents to separate recyclables and compostable material from household waste, which would have reduced the volume at the landfills. There are some researchers who are trying to better understand Indians' attitudes toward litter. Indian passengers do not like the sight of garbage around them, so they immediately throw it out of the train. After all, trains are so crowded that there is often no space for trash cans. Some in the tourism industry say that the garbage problem is overstated - and that it actually might be part of the adventure of traveling in India.

Owing to the indifference of the concerned authorities are exposed to dangerous diseases like dengue fever, malaria, hepatitis, dysentery and typhoid. Garbage heaps in several parts of the city has become a cause of concern for residents and the ugly face of the city. Let us take a pride in our environment. People will buy 8 grams of gold instead of 10; 50% reduction in purchases in cities including Ahmedabad, Surat compared to last year!



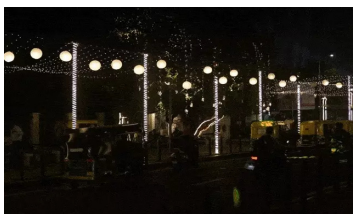

Surat An accident was caused by Nabira on the Udhana Darwaza overbridge in Surat yesterday. In which a cloth merchant was hit by the driver Nabira, the merchant died on the spot. Following the incident, driver Nabira was arrested by Salabaturia police. During the investigation, it was found that Nabira, who caused the accident, is used to driving the car at over speed under the influence of alcohol. In the past too, he has had many serious accidents under the influence of alcohol. Not only that, earlier in the Umra area, he tried to set fire to a petrol pump under the influence of alcohol. He also spent 70 days in jail in that matter. The family members are also disturbed due to the devastation. Dev's father has already passed away. While Dada is also trying to convince him. Nabira Dev Ahir is currently 24 years old. His parents passed away a few years ago and he currently lives with his grandfather in Yogi Complex in Adajan area. It has been working as a construction and builder since last three generations. In Surat, Dev is involved in the construction business after his father's death. After the death of his parents, he has not lived with his grandfather in a gleeful manner. His grandparents and younger brother are also disturbed.

He drives the car properly while I am sitting in the car. He further said that Surat went to stay at home after stopping his studies. I also have no idea about the habit of drinking alcohol and with whom. Someone has become addicted to drinking in the company of boys. To get rid of this alcohol addiction, I also put him in Kadodara Nisha Mukti Center for four months. I often tell my grandson not to drive his car at that speed. When I am sitting in the car, it drives the car smoothly. I always say to drive the car smoothly and I drive the car slowly. It will work if we arrive an hour late.

45-year-old Sanjay Dhoot was on his way to Surat railway station to pick up his parents who were coming to Surat from his native Rajasthan in Sahara apartment in City Light area of Surat. Meanwhile he was passing on Udhna Darwaza Bridge. At that time, a Nabiro named Dev Ahir was driving the car at full speed under the influence of alcohol. Meanwhile, he hit Sanjay's bike at full speed. So Sanjay was thrown about 15 to 20 feet and fell on the other side of the road. In this incident, 45-year-old Sanjay Dhoot died on the spot. Not only this, the accident caused by Nabira Dev Ahir was so serious that after the car hit the bike, he jumped the divider between the bridge and entered the wrong side and then made a U-turn and the car stopped in the middle of the divider again. The collision of the car with the divider placed between the bridge and the collision caused the airbag of the car to open. The accident of this car was so dangerous that even the tires of the car were worn on the roads. The speed of Dev Ahir's car is likely to be more than 100 when the accident occurred.
