

# 'PM Svanidhi' to the doorsteps of street vendors

Ahmedabad, Kudos to Modi government for launching the PM Svanidhi mobile App to bring the microcredit facility under the PM Svanidhi scheme to the doorsteps of street vendors. Street vendors are the most visible section of the informal economy. It is launched specially for providing affordable working capital loan to street vendors to resume their livelihoods that have been adversely affected due to lockdown. The street vendors may now take a loan of Rs 10,000 to reestablish their businesses hit by the coronavirus-led nationwide lockdown. Street vendors are one such vulnerable group. With lockdown, streets were deserted look. Street livelihood vanished all of a sudden. Most street vendors provide the main source of

income for their households, bringing food to their families and paying school fees for their children. These informal workers have strong linkages to the formal economy. This scheme targets to benefit over 50 lakh Street Vendors who had been vending on or before 24 March, 2020, in urban areas including those from surrounding peri-urban/ rural areas. Under the Scheme, the vendors can avail a working capital loan of up to Rs. 10,000, which is repayable in monthly instalments in the tenure of one year. This amount can be returned to the instalment within a year of the track. The loan will be transferred to the street vendors who repay the loan on behalf of the Government in their account as an annual interest subsidy of seven%. There is no provision of fine under the scheme. With almost no social security and in absence of cash transfer, it is very likely that the working capital can be consumed for meeting other exigencies. Street vendors contribute significantly to the informal as well as the overall urban economy in terms of employment and cheap availability of goods and services. During the COVID-19 pandemic and consequent

lockdowns the street vendors have adversely impacted their livelihoods that represent a live their life with dignity and self-respect through hard work. It is nice decision that the scheme is being implemented in all the cities. 108 cities are selected for saturation until September. The launch of the mobile application will give impetus to the implementation strategy of the scheme besides promoting paperless digital accessing of micro-credit facilities by the street vendors. "PM Svanidhi" will much helpful to Street vendors as there is no need to provide collateral security for the loan and would not attract any prepayment penalty charges. Timely or early repayment would make the borrowers eligible for an enhanced loan amount in the next cycle of working capital loan disbursement. # In Gujarat, mobile subscribers cross 7 crore-mark



AHMEDABAD: To meet growing work and education requirements digitally, an increasing number of people across Gujarat are opting for multiple mobile connections. According to the latest survey released by Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI), the number of subscribers crossed the 7-crore mark in June this year. With a net addition of 7.78 lakh connections in June alone, the tele-density i.e. number of mobile subscribers per 100 population has gone up to 114 in Gujarat - the sixth highest in India. In terms of tele-density, Gujarat lags behind Delhi (324), Himachal Pradesh (158), Punjab (140), Kerala

(135) and Maharashtra (117). Against a population of 6.1 crore persons according to the 2011 census, the state's mobile subscribers have clearly exceeded the total population, indicating that people are using multiple connections. The increase in mobile subscriber numbers is mainly attributed to work from home, online classes and resumption of businesses, according to telecom industry sources. "Demand for broadband connections has shot up heavily since the pandemic due to higher bandwidth requirements for online education as well as for work from home," said a telecom industry source. However, serviceability of broadband connections is a problem as all telecom players are expanding their optical fibre network, "said a telecom industry source. Gujarat has provided consistent internet connectivity however remains. People have begun

opting for multiple connections to ensure consistent connectivity. In fact, many people have bought a separate SIM card which is used solely by their kids," the source further explained.

# In the Supreme Court, representation matters



The photograph should be framed in every law school, preserved for history books and written about in inspirational tracts for children. It's the one where four women judges - three freshly elevated, one of whom, BV Nagarathna is slated to become our first woman chief justice (CJ) in 2027 though only for 36 days - flank the current CJ, NV Ramana. Given that it took 39 years to our first woman Supreme Court (SC) judge, Fatima Bevi in 1989, and 71 years to get eight women judges, the photograph is significant. Is it picture perfect? Far from it. While it signals the closing of the gender gap in the higher judiciary, the larger issue of diversity remains. Do we have enough representation from among the minorities? Where are the Dalits, Adivasis and LGBTQ+ judges? The swearing-in of three women is unprecedented," says Nikita Sonawane, co-founder, Criminal Justice and Police Accountability Project. "But we still have a long way to go. The photograph tells us that the collegium recognises that men alone cannot continue to rule on crucial constitutional and legal matters. This is welcome course correction and it's hard to imagine sliding back. One can only hope representation will expand in the years to come. The photograph also acknowledges a new generation of women who are aspirational, driven and, given the opportunity, as likely to succeed as men. We have just seen it in sport where women have returned from Tokyo with medals. In the lower judiciary, 36.45% of judges and magistrates are women. Of the candidates who qualified in 2019 for admission to the national law universities, 44% are women. Women don't lack ambition. They lack support, from physical

infrastructure (toilets and daycare facilities) to administrative (sabbaticals) to improve the leaking pipeline that lead so many to quit jobs mid-career as their children reach crucial board exam years and parents begin to age. Why does representation matter? After all, the biological fact of gender doesn't automatically qualify you as either feminist or misogynist. Male judges have made progressive observations on a range of issues from triple talaq to privacy and adultery. Women judges don't always root for their gender - it was a woman judge who acquitted a 39-year-old man of POCSO charges because there was no 'skin-to-skin' contact. Former CJI Ranjan Gogoi was absolved of sexual harassment charges by a three-member committee of peers that included two women. A world that comprises diverse human beings across religion, caste, gender, class, geography, ideology, cannot be governed by a singular set of upper class, dominant caste, majority religion men. It's the multitude of voices that make democratic vibrant. This needs to be reflected in all its institutions, including Parliament and the media. The photograph signals that moment when the SC finally set right a traditional omission. And for that reason alone, it is historic.

# Bihar villages to be illuminated with solar lights



Patna, After towns, villages across Bihar will be illuminated with street lights. Unlike the urban settlements, street lights in rural areas will be powered with solar energy, officials said. Emboldened by the assistance allocated by the Centre under the 15th Finance

Commission to enhance basic infrastructure in rural areas, the panchayat raj department has proposed to set up at least 10 street lights in each ward across the state. The state government has recently received a sum of ₹1,100 crore on the recommendations of the finance commission. "While the department has used a part of the grant to provide supply water to each household, a certain portion of it would be allocated for installing street lights," said the panchayat raj minister Samrat Chaudhary, adding that estimates were being made to launch the work immediately after the panchayat elections in December. The department has recently made a presentation in front of chief minister Nitish Kumar and got his nod to launch the Mukhyamantri Gramin Solar Light Yojna. During the meeting, the CM asked the officials to be particular about the selection of places as all its no locality deserving the street lights should be left out. Panchayat chief secretary, panchayat raj, Anrit Lal Meena said that a survey to identify suitable places across 1.14 lakh wards of over 3,000 panchayats was underway. "Once it is complete, the department will set the cabinet nod on the proposal," added Meena.
